Jonathan Temte, MD, PhD, is an associate professor of family medicine at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health. He joined the faculty of the Department of Family Medicine in September 1993. He received his BA from Luther College, Decorah, Iowa, in 1980, an MS in biological oceanography from Oregon State University in 1986, and a PhD in zoology from the University of Wisconsin in 1993. He has published widely in the area of reproductive timing of seals and sea lions. Dr. Temte pursued his medical training at the UW-Madison Medical School receiving his MD in 1987. He is a 1993 graduate of the Madison Family Practice Residency.

Dr. Temte currently serves as the chair of the Wisconsin Council on Immunization Practices and sits on pandemic influenza and bioterrorism working groups for the state of Wisconsin. He is the American Academy of Family Physicians liaison to the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices where he has been an active member of the ACIP Human Papillomavirus Vaccine working group as well as the Meningococcal working group and the Harmonized Schedule Working Group. His current research interests include viral disease surveillance and epidemiology in primary care, timing and cost-effectiveness of influenza treatments, management of febrile illnesses in children, immunization practice in primary care, and infectious disease aboard commercial airliners. Dr. Temte practices full-spectrum primary care medicine and trains family practice residents at Wingra Family Medical Center in south Madison.
