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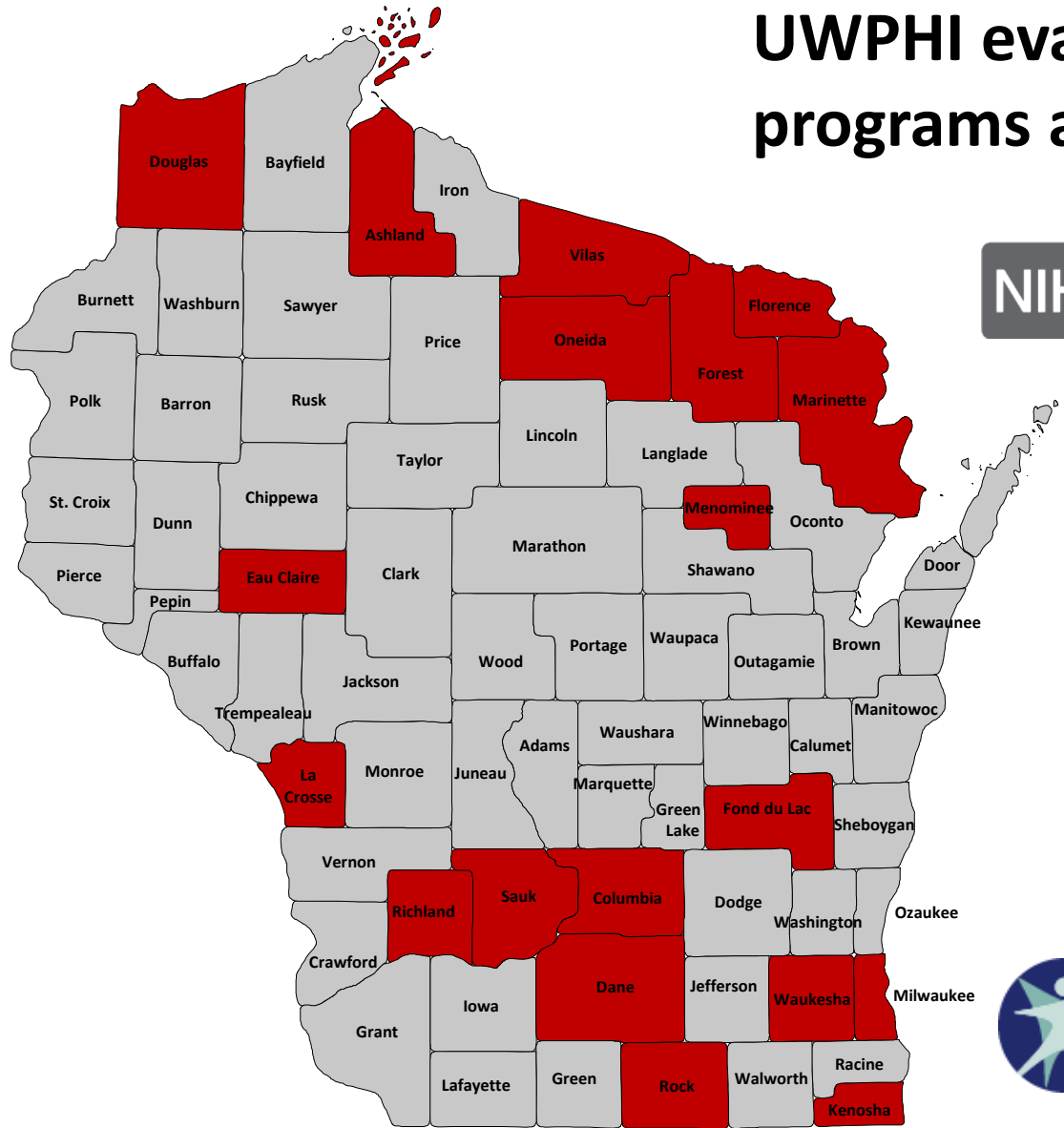
Why evaluation?

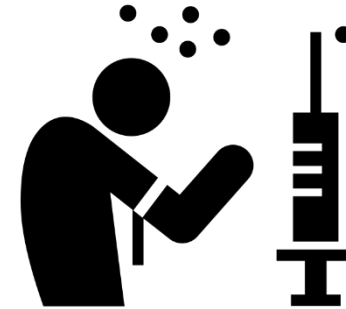

- Expand behavioral health Screening, Brief Intervention, Referral to Treatment (SBIRT)

- Increase distribution of naloxone to prevent death from overdoses
- Continuing treatment and support for addicted youth
