Working towards Vision Zero!

- First conceived in 1994 in Sweden, <u>Vision Zero</u> is a road safety policy which aims towards zero traffic deaths by the year 2020. The concept has now also been introduced in the UK, the Netherlands as well as the US.
- Toward Zero Deaths (TZD) otherwise known as the US National Strategy on Highway Safety was released in March 2015. TZD is the joint effort of a number of organizations and agencies that either own, operate, enforce or maintain roads across the US. These include the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators, the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials, the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance, Governors Highway Safety Association, the International Association of Chiefs of Police, the National Association of County Engineers, the National Association of State Emergency Medical Service Officials and the National Local Technical Assistance Program Association, with technical support provided by the Federal Highway Administration, the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.
- The strategy's key areas focus on safer road infrastructure that accommodates a
 diversity of road users including cyclists and pedestrians; safer drivers with speeding
 & alcohol impaired driving requiring particular attention; providing safer vehicles;
 enhancing medical emergency services to reduce injury outcomes; and improving
 safety management through enhancing collaboration between agencies and partners
 vested in road safety.
- The TZD also supports the <u>Decade of Action for Road Safety 2011–2020 goals</u> set by the United Nations General Assembly to improve global road safety.
